

Although London is a city we have many fantastic green spaces and there is no better time to enjoy them than the summer! This week try visiting Parkland Walk. Did you know that it is the longest Linear Nature Reserve in London at 4km in length, and follows the former railway line connecting Finsbury Park to Alexandra Palace, which opened in 1873? When we learn new things, we must keep practicing so that we don't forget. This week, recite your 4 and 8 times tables in your head while you're brushing your teeth. You do this twice a day so double the fun! Can you see the link between the 4 and 8 times table?

If you have not learn these yet, try it with the 5 and 10s times tables.

- Create a repeating pattern using the natural materials. For older children this could be turned into an algebraic sequence and can be used to predict what will come next, e.g. 2g, 1b, 2g, 1b..... Using a range of natural materials will make this more complex.


