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Work through the **White Rose** Activities to show what you have learnt.

Two musical instrument word searches of differing complexity will:

- revisit new instrument vocabulary learned from the interactive music map
- Retrieve vocabulary associated with common childhood play and classroom instruments (maracas, triangle, recorder etc..)

A word jigsaw based on all the instruments pictured on the interactive music map may challenge. Some prior knowledge and visual recognition of other instruments from previous classroom music will be involved.

Additional word search challenge available based on 26 instruments from across the world as inspiration to build upon previous musical instruments of the world activities.

A return to the Horniman Museum's online collection or the virtual encyclopaedia will be recommended to increase comprehension of new musical instrument vocabulary present.

Increasing musical instrument awareness and research skills will be encouraged.
